



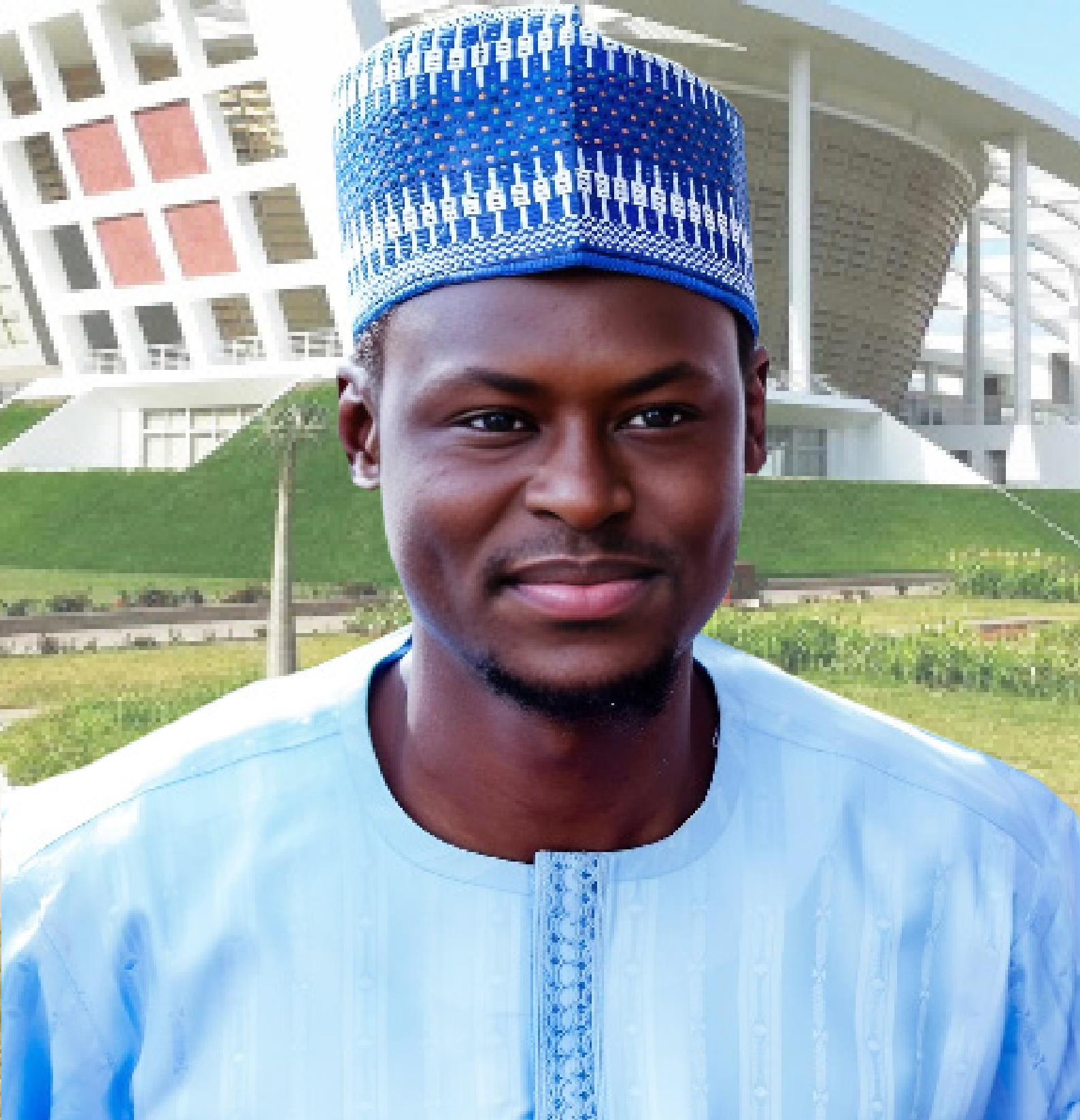

Dear Constituents,

As your Member of Parliament, I believe in staying connected with you, ensuring you are well-informed and actively engaged in the issues affecting our community. Over the years, I've come to understand that transparency and open communication are fundamental to a thriving democracy. With this in mind, I'm proud to present this newsletter, an important part of my Four-Point Agenda, and one of the ways I strive to keep you informed and involved in the legislative process.

The Banjul Central Newsletter will serve as a platform where I'll provide regular updates on my work, legislative activities, upcoming events, and opportunities for you to contribute to shaping the policies that impact our lives. I will also share my views on current issues and invite your feedback and thoughts to ensure a dialogue between us.

As Members of Parliament, our role goes beyond simply voting on bills. We represent the interests and views of our constituents in the National Assembly, contributing to debates, proposing legislation, and scrutinizing the government's actions through committees. We are dedicated to holding the government accountable, engaging with ministers, and proposing amendments to improve or challenge laws that impact our communities.

In this edition, I would like to highlight some of the key issues currently affecting Banjul Central and the wider Gambia:

Affordable Housing and Accessibility

Affordable housing continues to be one of the most significant challenges faced by residents of Banjul City. Many people have expressed concern about

the high costs of housing, which are pushing some families to move to other cities. This is an issue I've raised consistently, and I am working closely with my colleagues in the National Assembly to find practical solutions. Recently, we successfully passed the Rent Amendment Act, 2024, which will improve the rent payment structure for both landlords and tenants when approved. I also raised the issue with the Minister of Justice, who informed me that a comprehensive Rent Bill is under development, which will address the broader challenges of housing in our community.

Combating Drugs and Crime

Drug abuse and crime have become serious concerns, not just in Banjul but across the country. I have consistently raised these issues in Parliament and pushed for initiatives aimed at tackling the root causes of these problems. These issues require a multi-faceted approach, from increasing funding for rehabilitation programs and mental health services to stricter penalties for those responsible for drug trafficking. I am also working with the Africa Drug-Free Foundation to create a program aimed at helping those struggling with addiction transition into productive lives.

Healthcare Access and Reform

Access to affordable healthcare is a fundamental right for every citizen, yet many in our community are still unable to afford basic medical care. This is something I feel strongly about, especially following the recent relocation of the emergency services at our local hospital, which has further exacerbated the situation. My office has been actively pushing for reforms that would make healthcare more accessible to everyone, regardless of their income. This includes advocating for better use of public healthcare funds, expanding insurance coverage, and investing in preventative care.

I've also raised the need for greater focus on mental health services and drug rehabilitation, areas that have been overlooked for far too long.

Environmental Protection and Land Use

Environmental issues, particularly the destruction of our wetlands and mangrove forests, continue to be a major concern for our community. In Parliament, I have repeatedly raised the need to protect these crucial ecosystems from illegal construction and pollution. The Minister of Environment recently announced that construction in the Tanbi Wetland area will be halted, a significant step forward in preserving our environment. While there is still much to be done, these ongoing efforts signal that positive change is possible when we work together.

Fighting Corruption and Economic Mismanagement

Recently, Parliament passed the Anti-Corruption Bill, which is a significant achievement in the fight against corruption. This bill will help ensure that public resources are used efficiently and transparently, benefiting all citizens. We are also working to strengthen public institutions, promote integrity, and encourage accountability among government officials.

As you review the content, I encourage you to revisit the four-point agenda that we presented during our campaign. This will allow you to evaluate our progress based on the promises we made and provide valuable feedback. By doing so, I will be better equipped to represent your interests, both as a community member and as a citizen of The Gambia. Thank you for your unwavering support. Together, we can work towards a brighter future for our community and for all Gambians.

I remain fully committed to serving you and advocating for policies that address these critical issues. Together, we can work to improve our community and create a brighter future for all. Thank you for your continued trust and support.

Gambia and his team for their inspiring leadership in organizing the challenge. He prayed for Allah SWT to accept all efforts in nurturing and preserving the environment for the benefit of all.

Hon Abdoulie Njai's foresight on ghost workers



Last year December 2024, Hon. Abdoulie Njai stood in Parliament and delivered a pointed oral question to the Minister of Public Service on the alarming issue of “ghost workers” who have been draining The Gambia’s payroll integrity .

His intervention anticipated the Ministry’s own 16 April 2025 press release, which revealed that Phase One of the 2024 staff audit had halted salaries for 1,424 absentee workers across key ministries pending verification . That same release confirmed that the December 2024 second phase of the audit flagged an additional 679 public servants who could not be physically identified, leading to the suspension of their salaries from April 2025 until they provide credible clarification.

Financial institutions were promptly instructed to recover wrongful payments, while the Public Service Commission received lists of unaccounted-for staff with recommendations for summary dismissal under Regulation 57, underscoring the government’s commitment to reclaiming misdirected funds.

This Parliamentary question built on Njai’s earlier advocacy in October 2024, when the Personnel Management Office detected over 2,142 ghost workers during preliminary audits discovery he championed for thorough

parliamentary debate. His consistent follow-up in committee hearings and plenary sessions has raised eyebrows across the public service establishment, driving momentum for broader administrative reforms.

STANCE ON RECENT DEMONSTRATIONS

As I observe developments from official international duties, it is evident that denying permits for peaceful assemblies risks escalating tensions. In this case, a group of fewer than thirty individuals submitted a lawful request to gather peacefully. The assembly though unlawful, the Inspector General of Police (IGP) could have simply granted the permit with reasonable conditions to ensure public order. This measured approach would have aligned with procedural fairness while mitigating the potential for conflict.

We call for their unconditional release!. I urge fellow youths to remain calm and disciplined as we wait: keep gatherings peaceful, document any violations of rights, and seek legal counsel when necessary. Our moral authority depends on our steadfast adherence to democratic norms and nonviolence.

At the same time, I wish to caution political actors against exploiting these demonstrations for partisan gain. Genuine calls for transparency

should not be weaponized for narrow political advantage and using young people and capitalizing in these fragile moments. Rather we must focus solely on upholding justice and serving the public interest. The call is genuine and need not to be blemished.

While we consistently honor the bravery and dedication of our security forces, I must unequivocally condemn the excessive and unjustifiable violence exhibited by certain personnel toward peaceful protesters. Such actions marked by unwarranted aggression and disregard for proportionality betray the principles of public trust and professionalism. This troubling pattern exposes glaring deficiencies in our ongoing security sector reforms. Moving forward, robust accountability mechanisms and comprehensive retraining programs must be prioritized to realign institutional conduct with the values of restraint, dignity, and service to the people.

As Parliament gears for an extra ordinary session on the matter, I appeal to fellow elected representatives to engage this matter with conscience and objectivity remembering that accountability transcends party lines.

By now we should have learnt from the past, ensuring any reform to our laws on peaceful assembly should strengthen, rather than erode, fundamental rights.

At this critical juncture while cherished comrades remain confined we must resist the urge to exploit these moments for personal grandstanding. This is not a time for self-promotion, but for solidarity and introspection. Let us pause to reflect deeply on our shared purpose: to assess where we stand as a movement and as a nation, and to chart a unified, principled path forward. Only through collective clarity and resolve can we navigate these challenges with integrity.

Gambia Earns Key Committee Seats Through Strategic Diplomacy in Jakarta

Hon. Njai actively participated in negotiations aimed at securing regional representation within PUIC Standing Committees.

At the core of the conference was the Consultation Meeting of the African Group, where Hon. Njai served as The Gambia's chief negotiator, engaging with counterparts from across the continent to build consensus around regional representation within PUIC organs. Amid rigorous dialogue and strategic diplomacy, The Gambia secured places on the Committee on Political Affairs and the Committee on Women and Gender a significant advancement that places our nation at the center of decision-making on critical issues of governance, equity, and development. This Positions The Gambia as a credible and committed partner in global dialogue.

Fellow delegates from the Gambia also took part in various Standing Specialized Committee meetings, including observing the Economic Affairs and Environment Committee, where member states shared insights on strategies for sustainable development and economic cooperation. It is worth noting that The Gambia previously held a seat on the Economic Affairs Committee.

Beyond institutional matters, delegation also participated in a bilateral meeting with representatives of the Palestinian Parliament, reinforcing The Gambia's principled stance on justice, peace, and solidarity with the Palestinian people.

As part of the Standing Specialized Committee (SSC) meetings, The Gambia observed proceedings of the Economic Affairs and Environment Committee, where member states exchanged ideas on promoting sustainable development and economic cooperation across OIC countries.

Hon. K k Barrow head of delegation participated in the 53rd Meeting of the PUIC Executive Committee, where members adopted the



agenda, reviewed the Secretary General's report, and updated the draft agendas of key PUIC organs, including the Standing Committees on Political Affairs, Economic Affairs, Human Rights and Family, and the Committees on Palestine and Muslim Minorities.

The delegation then held a bilateral meeting with representatives of the Palestinian Parliament. The Gambian side expressed solidarity with the people of Palestine and reiterated the National Assembly's support for lasting peace and justice in the region. Hon. Njai later joined the rest of the delegation for the final sessions of the

19th PUIC Conference on Thursday, 15 May. Key activities included the adoption of resolutions during the Work Session and contributions to the Closing Session, where member states formalized outcomes on political, economic, and human rights priorities.

Moving forward, we will do our best to position the gambia into the executive Committee. Through diplomacy grounded in values and vision, We will rewrite the story of youth in leadership placing The Gambia at the heart of international policy discourse.

An Unforgettable Flood In Banjul



Between July 30th and 31st, 2022, heavy rainfall caused widespread flooding across The Gambia, affecting places like Banjul City, Kanifing Municipality, the West Coast, and the North Bank Regions. The torrential downpour led to severe damage, forcing many residents to seek shelter in public buildings, such as mosques and schools, to stay safe.

Tragically, on July 30th, five children lost their lives in the North Bank Region due to the accompanying thunderstorms, while one child in the West Coast Region also perished. By July 31st, 2022, the National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA) reported that nearly 1,961 households had been impacted by the floods. However, a subsequent assessment by the Gambian Red Cross Society (GRCS) on August 2nd, 2022, confirmed that 606 households, or approximately 7,021 individuals, had suffered severe damage, losing homes, food supplies, and latrines.

The situation worsened on July 31st when the second wave of flooding hit Banjul, adding to the accumulated water and

resulting in the contamination of water supplies due to sewage disposal. The crisis underscored the urgent need for coordinated efforts between the government and relevant agencies to prevent further devastation.

In response, Honorable Abdoulie Njai, alongside the Banjul Red Cross Branch and Banjul North Member of Parliament, Hon. Modou Lamin B. Bah, Banjul Youth Committee and other volunteers committee, quickly assessed the situation and developed an emergency response plan. Their primary goal was to provide shelter for affected residents who could no longer stay in their homes. Through community surveys and

outreach efforts, they identified the most vulnerable households and set up an emergency response hotline to address housing needs. Their on-the-ground evaluations revealed widespread damage in Banjul, with many families losing their possessions. In a show of solidarity, Honorable Njai and his team provided support to those most in need, offering reassurance during these trying times.

On August 6th, Honorable Njai met with partners from the HMD Charity Foundation to discuss post-flood relief efforts. After assessing the worst-hit areas, the foundation supported 100 families in Banjul by providing essential supplies and financial aid. Additionally, on August 10th, a charitable group donated D25,000 to Honorable Njai's office, which, along with his own financial contribution, allowed for the distribution of aid to 25 families through the United Zone Fulbeh's humanitarian projects.

The Banjul Central office expressed deep gratitude for the swift and invaluable support from humanitarian organizations, highlighting their commitment to helping the community recover from the devastating floods.

Condemning the Assault on Gaza

As a Member of Parliament and a servant of conscience, I stand today with a heart heavy with grief and outrage at the relentless bombardment of Gaza. The images of lifeless children pulled from rubble, the wails of mothers clutching fragments of their shattered homes, and the suffocating despair of a people under siege demand not just our tears, but our collective voice and action. This is not a conflict it is a humanitarian catastrophe, a grotesque violation of international law, and a moral failure of the highest order. The recent escalation has claimed hundreds of lives, including scores of innocent civilians, with infrastructure reduced to dust and hospitals overwhelmed beyond capacity. The world cannot turn away from Gaza's

cries. As a Muslim, I am bound by the teachings of the Quran to "stand firmly for justice, as witnesses to God, even if it be against yourselves" (Surah An-Nisa 4:135). Silence in the face of oppression is complicity. We must name this injustice: the indiscriminate killing of civilians, the blockade suffocating millions, and the systemic erasure of Palestinian dignity are crimes against humanity. In this dark hour, I call upon my fellow Muslims and all people of conscience to turn to prayer as an act of resistance. Let us bow our heads in salah and raise our hands in dua, seeking the Almighty's mercy for the victims and strength for the oppressed. May He grant patience to the bereaved, healing to the wounded, and courage to those who

document and resist this brutality. Ya Allah, bring an end to this tyranny. May the oppressors be cursed in their injustice, and may the scales of justice tip swiftly toward the people of Palestine.

But prayer without action is incomplete. The Quran reminds us, "God does not change the condition of a people until they change what is on themselves" (Surah Ar-Ra'd 13:11). We must channel our anguish into advocacy:

To the people of Gaza: Your resilience is a beacon to the world. We see you. We hear you. And we will not rest until justice prevails.

But justice cannot wait for politics. It begins with us in our prayers, our protests, and our unwavering refusal to normalize oppression.

Concerns over Government's unsubstantiated takeover of McCarthy Square

Hon. Abdoulie Njai in his recent adjournment debate reiterated his critique of the government's abrupt seizure of McCarthy Square park, stressing that his objection lies not in the principle of state stewardship but in the execution of unilateral government control. Hon. Abdoulie Njai further argued that while the local council has long neglected its duty to revitalize the area, the administration's heavy-handed intervention bypassed essential dialogue with stakeholders. He emphasized that neither inaction nor unilateral action serves the public interest, urging collaborative solutions to address the square's challenges.

Concerns over Government's unsubstantiated takeover of McCarthy Square

Banjul, The Gambia

Office of NAM Banjul Central constituency under the leadership of Hon. Abdoulie Njai hereby expresses concern over the Government of The Gambia's decision to seize control of McCarthy Square, a historic public space at the heart of Banjul (Banjul central). The square has for generations been a cornerstone of civic life but in recent years bureaucratic barriers from government have kept us from exploring its full potential. The Local Government Act clearly outlines the authority of local councils to manage municipal properties and public assets.

This unilateral takeover seeks to erase our ownership entirely further alienating Banjulians from a cherished communal asset that rightfully belongs to them.

If negotiations prove futile, we welcome the Council's decision to pursue legal action against the move, as it is a critical defence of our local autonomy. I urge every citizen to join us in peaceful resistance, to reject this decision, and to reclaim McCarthy Square through unity, advocacy, and unwavering resolve. Together, we will ensure this symbol of our shared identity remains in the hands of the people.

On July 5, 2023, amidst public controversy surrounding the vehicle allocation for National Assembly members, Hon. A. Njai addressed the misinformation, providing clarity on the matter.

The vehicle scheme, introduced by the Fifth Legislative Assembly, was designed to prevent undue influence from external parties and ensure transparency. Each of the 58 National Assembly members is required to contribute 50% of the vehicle's cost, which is D2.5 million per vehicle, and is responsible for maintenance, insurance, and fuel.

The government ensures that the vehicles meet high standards through a regulated procurement



process. The vehicles are part of a long-term strategy to establish a revolving fund for future legislatures. Hon. Njai emphasized that the scheme fosters financial

responsibility and ensures that parliamentarians can efficiently carry out their duties across the country while maintaining the integrity of the National Assembly.

The Strength in Unity: Engaging Councilors on Collective Development Roadmap



September 24, 2023, Hon. Abdoulie Njai convened a collaborative meeting with the three councilors representing within the Banjul Central Constituency: Councilor Tunko Jammeh of Soldier Town, Councilor Mahmoud Ceesay of New Town West, and Councilor Ebou Sarr of New Town East.

The purpose of the meeting was to brainstorm ideas and strategies to enhance collective efforts in serving the

constituency effectively, while fostering a strong relationship with grassroots stakeholders. This gathering emphasized the importance of consultative collaboration in governance.

The meeting provided a platform for the councilors to share insights, offer feedback on potential working models, and identify emerging needs and priorities within their respective wards.

The councilors expressed appreciation for the engagement, describing it as a first-of-its-kind initiative. They reiterated their

commitment to collectively addressing ward-specific issues and concerns.

This initiative aligns with Hon. Njai's 4-Point agenda of "inclusivity," underscoring the importance of collective action and collaboration to deliver quality service to constituents. By working together, the councilors and Hon. Njai aim to tackle community challenges and fulfill their obligations to the people they serve.

Community Engagement: Policy Dialogue and Legislative Status Briefing

On October 23, 2023, Hon. Abdoulie Njai engaged in an essential community policy dialogue aimed at updating his constituents on his legislative and advocacy work. The event also provided a platform for responding to questions from community members, underscoring the importance of transparency and open communication in governance.



This interaction fostered a deeper understanding between the representative and the community, ensuring that the concerns and aspirations of the people he serves are heard and addressed.

Organized by Activista in collaboration with Freedom House, the dialogue allowed Hon. Njai to engage directly with attendees and

encouraged feedback, showcasing his commitment to accountability and responsiveness. By actively listening to constituents, he aimed to gain insights into their perspectives, which will inform his legislative agenda.

The session not only served as a chance for Hon. Njai to provide updates on ongoing initiatives but

also allowed the community to voice their concerns on various issues affecting their lives. This exchange helped build trust and understanding between the representative and the people.

Hon. Njai reaffirmed his commitment to continuous dialogue with the community, pledging to work tirelessly to address their needs. He emphasized his dedication to being an accessible and responsive representative and to advocating for positive change and progress in Banjul Central.

Special recognition was given to event facilitators, including Activista The Gambia, Freedom House, and The Gambia National Youth Parliament, whose support was vital in organizing the dialogue. Their collaboration exemplifies the importance of collective efforts in fostering civic engagement and participatory governance.

Periodic Constituency Engagement

As a dedicated public servant, Hon. Abdoulie Njai prioritizes structured, regular engagement with various segments of his constituency. Through quarterly initiatives, Hon. Njai employs tailored approaches to ensure effective communication and representation. Interactions with children and teenagers focus on their school activities and routine visits, while youth engagements take place at popular local spots like the "Vous," promoting informal dialogue. For older generations, including community, religious, and traditional leaders, Hon. Njai visits their homes to share updates on parliamentary work and gather insights.

These quarterly engagements serve as proactive measures to foster inclusivity, gather diverse perspectives, and ensure that all community voices



are represented in decision-making processes. This ongoing communication helps uphold the principles of democratic governance and strengthens public service in the constituency.

Dialogue On Rent Amendment Bill With Banjulians

Over the issue of rent, Hon. Abdoulie Njai, in February 2024 hosted a community dialogue on the proposed Rent Amendment Bill, providing Banjul residents with an opportunity to voice their concerns regarding the current state of rental housing in the city.

During the discussion, residents expressed dissatisfaction with the frequent rent increases, which they argued placed undue financial strain on tenants. Many shared personal experiences of facing sudden and significant rent hikes, making housing increasingly unaffordable.

In addition to the rent hikes, residents also highlighted issues related to the substandard conditions of rental properties, including inadequate amenities and poor maintenance. Many tenants expressed frustration



with landlords who neglect their responsibilities to ensure safe and habitable living conditions.

In response, Hon. Njai pledged to advocate for provisions in the Rent Amendment Bill that would establish minimum housing standards and hold landlords accountable.

Another key issue raised was the high cost of rental deposits, with some landlords demanding deposits equivalent to several months' rent. Residents called for legislation to

cap these deposits to ensure greater affordability for tenants. Additionally, Hon. Njai supported the reinstatement of local rental tribunals, which would provide a forum for resolving disputes between tenants and landlords in a fair and transparent manner.

As the discussion concluded, residents expressed appreciation for Hon. Njai's advocacy and his commitment to ensuring their concerns are addressed in the legislative process.

Intervention On Nawec Issues

After several hours without water, causing significant disruptions in Banjul Central and surrounding areas, Hon. Abdoulie Njai engaged with senior NAWEC officials. It was determined that the water shortage stemmed from a burst pipe along the pipeline near the Mile 2 area.

Upon investigation, Hon. Njai met with NAWEC personnel, who were actively working to address the issue. Soon after investigation, the issue was resolved and announced while water supplying restored.

However, reports received after restoration concerning the water quality indicated that the quality was a temporary situation caused by the burst pipe and the necessary

repairs. The quality returned to normal shortly as the system clears all residual impurities.

Hon. Njai expressed his sincere appreciation to the NAWEC team for their swift and effective response in resolving the issue. These are one of several interventions of this nature..



National Assembly Committee Recommendation From 2022-2025 based on recent reporting and official actions:

The National Assembly's committees have been active in oversight and policy direction across multiple sectors. In 2025 the Finance and Public Accounts Committee (FPAC) successfully moved recommendations to curb unauthorized virements, tighten budget discipline, and require audited financial reconciliations and improved personnel records, with deadlines and potential sanctions attached. Committees also urged more stringent adherence to procurement and payroll rules and timely statutory remittances.

Select committees have exposed systemic governance issues, most notably in the land administration sector, where the Committee on Regional Government and Lands found outdated laws and manual processes undermining land registration and recommended a comprehensive national land policy, law reform, digital systems, staffing improvements, and logistics support with a 90-day action timeline for the responsible ministry.

Parliamentarians have also acted on accountability recommendations: a joint committee report on petroleum sector irregularities called for the censure of two ministers for alleged misconduct and urged independent review panels and policy reviews to enhance institutional integrity.

In education, the Select Committee on Education, Training and ICT urged government to implement recommendations from its visits, including reviewing school fee policies and strengthening core curriculum requirements like history, agriculture, and social studies.

Across these actions, committees have consistently combined findings from audits, field visits, and oversight hearings with clear remedial recommendations, often with timelines for reporting back on compliance to the Assembly.

Counting the above gives at least 27 distinct bills that the 6th Legislature passed between its commencement in 2022 and information currently available in 2025 where they were formally approved by the Assembly and, in most cases, assented to by the President.

• **Criminal Procedure Bill, 2020** — Completed parliamentary proceedings, replacing the old criminal procedure code.

• **Criminal Offences Bill, 2020** — Likewise completed and poised for assent, modernizing offence definitions.

• **National Research & Innovation Fund Bill, 2024** — Passed to establish funding for research and innovation.

• **The Gambia Tertiary and Higher Education Trust Fund Bill, 2024** — Passed to support higher education financing.

• **Mutual Legal Assistance in Criminal Matters Bill, 2019** — Passed and assented during the 6th Legislature.

• **Gambia Anti-Corruption Bill, 2019** — Passed and assented.

• **Prevention and Prohibition of Torture Bill, 2020** — Passed and assented.

• **Elections Bill, 2021** — Passed during Assembly sessions and awaiting presidential assent.

Rent (Amendment) Bill, 2024 — Amends the 2014 Rent Act to modernize rent valuation, regulate increases, and allow monthly payments to ease tenant burdens. Passed the Assembly and now awaiting presidential assent.

• **Judicial Officers (Conditions of Service) Bill, 2025** — Establishes terms of service, remuneration, allowances, and protections for judges and magistrates, helping operationalize constitutional provisions on judicial independence.

• **Elections Bill (2021/2025)** — Replaces the old Elections Act with a new framework aimed at strengthening electoral processes; passage was reported amid some controversy.

• **Medicine and Related Products Bill** — Passed by the Assembly as part of a package of bills in late 2025, intended to update the legal framework on medical products regulation.

• **Personal Data Protection and Privacy Bill** — Approved during the same late-2025 session; introduces protections for personal data and privacy rights.

• **National Security Council Bill** — Another bill passed in the late-2025 legislative session focusing on national security institutional framework.

In addition to these clearly reported recent bills, parliamentary records indicate that several other major law-making processes were active or completed in the 6th Legislature, including:

• **Criminal Procedure Bill and Criminal Offences Bill (2020/2025)** — Historic criminal justice reforms replacing old colonial era codes.

• **National Research & Innovation Fund Bill, 2024** — Passed to support scientific research and innovation funding.

• **The Gambia Tertiary and Higher Education Trust Fund Bill, 2024** — Passed to create sustainable funding for higher education.

Parliamentary Committee Assignments

Hon. Abdoulie Njai sits on multiple parliamentary committees, which bring together Members of Parliament to focus on specific areas of legislation, oversight, and government accountability.

He is a Member of the Select Committee on Regional Government, Lands, Ombudsman and the Independent Electoral Commission (IEC). In this role, he contributes to the review of local government administration, land governance, the work of the Ombudsman in addressing complaints against public institutions, and oversight of the IEC. His participation supports the scrutiny of laws and policies affecting these critical governance sectors.

He also serves as a Member of the Standing Committee on Public Enterprises, which examines the management and performance of state-owned enterprises and public agencies, including utilities, telecommunications, transport, and postal services. Through this committee, he helps hold public enterprises accountable for service delivery and the use of public funds.

In addition, Hon. Njai is a Member of the Select Committee on Monitoring the Implementation of Government Projects. The committee tracks the execution of government-funded projects to ensure efficiency, transparency, and value for money. As a member, he reviews project progress and contributes to reports presented to Parliament.

Committee work remains central to parliamentary effectiveness, and his membership reflects sustained involvement in detailed legislative review and oversight.

Regional Leadership Roles



At the regional level, Hon. Njai serves as Chairperson of the West Africa Young Parliamentarians Network, a newly launched body bringing together young legislators from across the sub-region. In this capacity, he leads efforts to strengthen cooperation among young lawmakers, advance youth inclusion in policymaking, and build institutional capacity across West Africa. His role extends beyond The Gambia, contributing to policy dialogue and collaboration with peers in Liberia, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, and other countries.

International Engagements

Internationally, Hon. Njai serves as Deputy Speaker of the International Youth Parliament, a global platform that convenes young representatives from multiple countries. Through this role, he engages with youth leaders worldwide on issues including governance, education, and inclusive public policy.

He also serves as Country Representative to the International Society of

City and Urban Regional Planners (ISOCARP), where he represents Gambian interests in international discussions on urban development, sustainable cities, and regional planning.

In addition, Hon. Njai engages through the Parliamentary Union of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (PUIC), participating in parliamentary diplomacy and supporting cooperation on peacebuilding, development, and youth inclusion across the Islamic world.

What These Roles Mean in Practice

Through parliamentary committee service, Hon. Njai plays a direct role in legislative review, budget scrutiny, and oversight of government actions. His regional leadership focuses on alliance-building and advancing shared youth priorities across West Africa, while his international engagements project Gambian perspectives globally and facilitate the exchange of ideas that inform national policy.

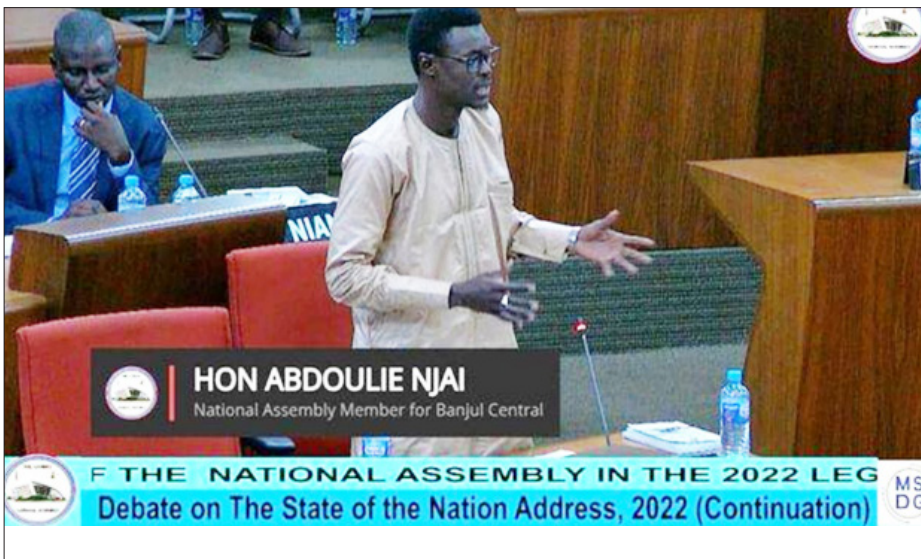
State of the Nation Address 2022

On September 16th, 2022, in accordance with section 77(1) of the 1997 Constitution, President Adama Barrow delivered the State of the Nation Address (SONA), marking a key moment in the sixth legislature. The address provided an overview of The Gambia's condition, outlined the Government's policies, and presented its agenda for the upcoming year.

During his address, President Barrow highlighted the administration's achievements, particularly in combating the COVID-19 pandemic, and discussed progress made under the 33 Economic Reconstruction and Recovery Plan, which focuses on job creation and economic revitalization. He used the occasion to reaffirm the Government's commitment to transparency, accountability, and addressing socio-economic challenges, with a focus on promoting inclusive growth and national development.



Honorable Abdoulie Njai's Response to SONA



On September 21st, 2022, Honorable Abdoulie Njai, the Member of Parliament for Banjul Central, expressed his concerns over the presence of foreign security personnel at the State House, warning that without proper precautions, it could pose a risk to national security and increase the potential for espionage. During the discussions following the State of the Nation Address (SONA), Honorable Njai raised several issues regarding governance and transparency.

He questioned the justification for the

\$20 security levy of the Securiport and called for clarification on the use of COVID-19 funds. Additionally, he addressed concerns about ongoing demolitions and criticized the government's handling of a press conference at the Kairaba Conference Centre regarding a particular project, which he believed failed to address important financial queries.

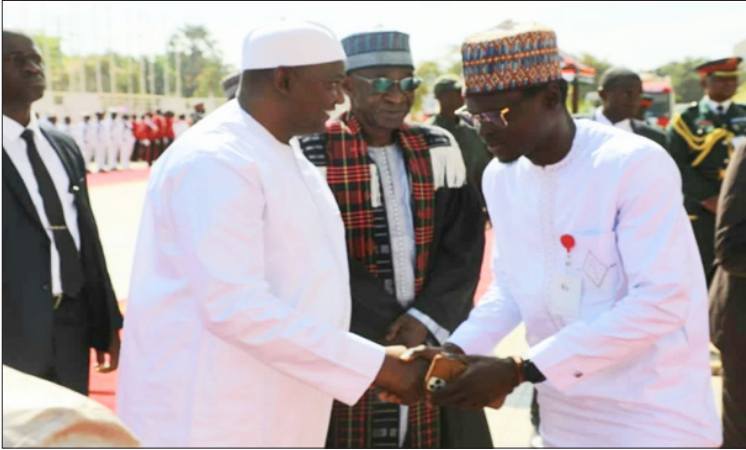
Honorable Njai also scrutinized the Banjul Roads Project, which had been questioned by auditors for non-compliance with the Gambia Public Procurement Authority

(GPPA) regulations. He expressed disappointment that the press conference did not clarify monetary issues or confirm whether the project met the specifications outlined in the contract. The Auditor General's report on the government's 2019 financial statements revealed several irregularities in the Banjul Roads Project, including the commencement of work before the contract was signed.

In response to these findings, Accountant General Agnes Macaulay explained the urgency of the project due to the deteriorating condition of Banjul's drainage and sewage systems. She also noted that Gai Enterprise, which was selected for the project, had been deemed capable by the Ministry of Works. However, auditors emphasized the lack of preparation and due diligence, highlighting the need for thorough assessments before awarding large contracts.

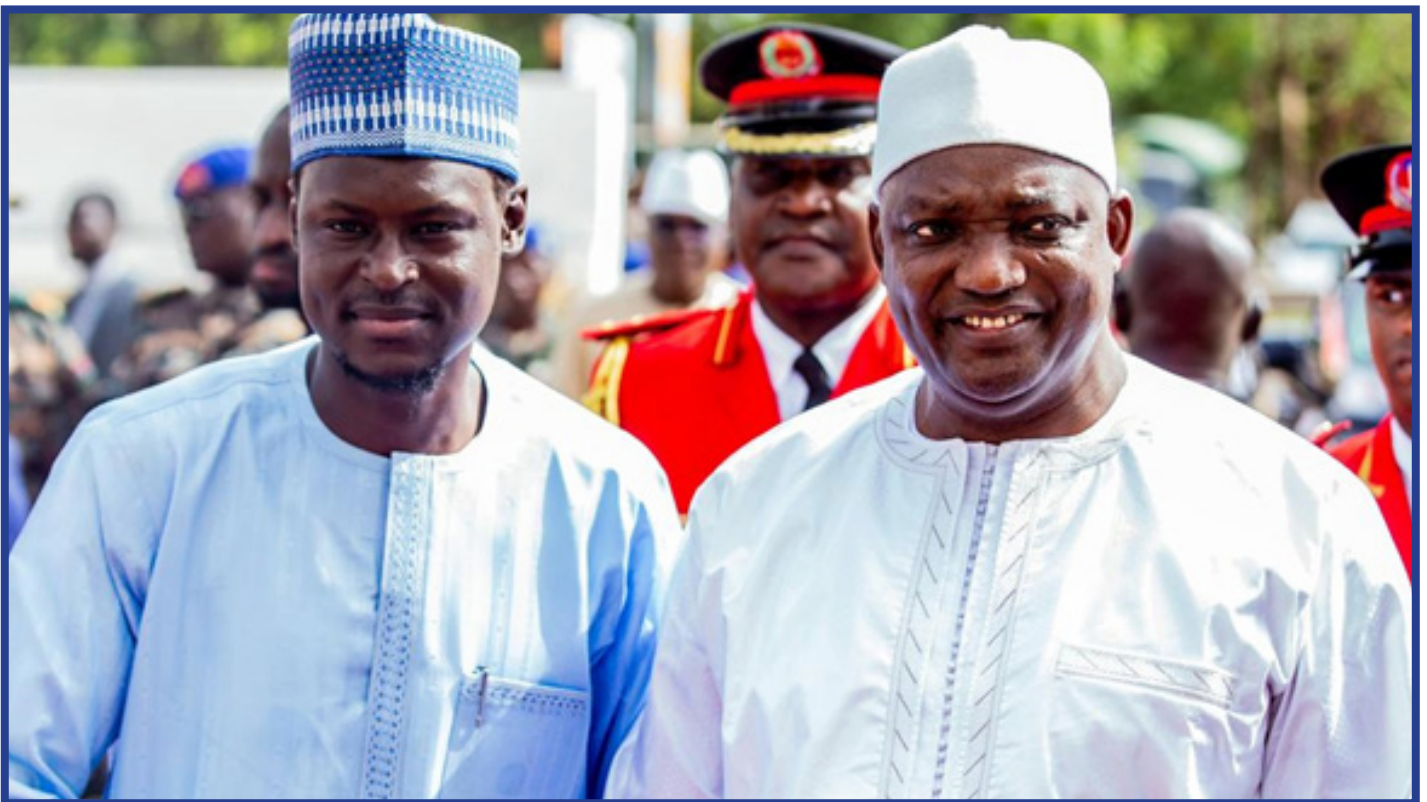
As a member of the Select Committee on Monitoring Government Projects, he continues to advocate for better governance and accountability.

The National Youth Council recognized the critical role of young parliamentarians in societal transformation and emphasized the need for continued exposure and opportunities to empower them as catalysts for positive change. The initiative was executed in collaboration with the Centre for Political Debates (CPD), reaffirming a collective commitment to empowering the next generation of Gambian leaders.

Social Audit and Public Hearing on Water Issues

Bringing Institutions Closer to the People



On November 1, 2023, Hon. Abdoulie Njai took proactive steps to address water issues in the greater Banjul area, where communities continue to face water shortages, low water pressure, and concerns about water quality. As part of a comprehensive social audit on water, conducted in collaboration with the International Republican Institute (IRI), Hon. Njai worked with members of the Public Enterprise Committee (PEC) to engage various stakeholders, including households, the Banjul City Council (BCC), and the National Water and Electricity Company (NAWEC), to understand the root causes of these issues.

Following the findings of the audit, a public hearing was held at McCarthy Square, where NAWEC's Water Department officials interacted directly with residents. This transparent forum allowed stakeholders to voice concerns about the water shortage and quality, fostering accountability. Hon. Njai also visited households in Banjul to gather firsthand feedback, demonstrating his hands-on approach to understanding constituent concerns.

In alignment with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 6, which calls for clean water and sanitation for all, Hon. Njai remains

committed to ensuring Banjul does not lack access to clean water. He is determined to collaborate with stakeholders and advocate for solutions to address the erratic water supply in the region. Hon. Njai also expressed gratitude to PEC, IRI, and NAWEC for their support in driving this initiative forward. Through collective efforts, there is a strong commitment to ensuring reliable and clean water for all in Banjul.



Hon. Abdoulie Njai recently delivered a Lecture | Organized by World Beyond War The Gambia Chapter Theme: “Policy and Governance – Engaging Decision-Makers in the Efforts to Stop Killer Robots”



Speaking to a gathering of university students, fellow policymakers, academics, CSO representatives, and youth leaders on one of the most urgent global threats of our time . “autonomous weapon system” more commonly referred to as “KillerRobots”

He drew upon the profound ethical restraint of Imam Ali (RA), who once withheld his sword during battle when his enemy spat in his face fearing he might strike out of personal anger rather than justice. This timeless moment reminds us why human morality must never be outsourced to algorithms. The devastating consequences of removing human conscience from the

chain of command in warfare, Gaza and similar conflict zones show the real-time impact of surveillance drones and AI-powered targeting systems where precision often becomes permission for destruction.

The environmental and climate impacts of war-tech production rare earth mining, carbon-heavy logistics, and toxic residue disproportionately affect vulnerable regions like Africa. Africa's severe vulnerability due to lack of AI military capability, while ironically, we remain the source of critical raw materials used in tech warfare.

Hon. Njai further lectured on: The growing global push for a binding international treaty to ban lethal

autonomous weapons. The G8 bloc's resistance, their strategic vetoes at the UN Security Council, and reluctance to level the playing field.

I also highlighted the role of African charters, including the Kampala Convention, the AU Convention on Cybersecurity, and the Common African Position on UN reforms; emphasized



legislative responsibilities of national parliaments, especially in drafting laws that align ethics, accountability, and technological sovereignty.

As Africa stands at the intersection of global technological ambition and domestic vulnerability, shaping these norms require collective efforts from a regional perspective.

National Youth Leadership Forum

On April 27, 2022, the National Youth Leadership Forum took place at Nana Conference Hall, organized by Peace Hub-The Gambia. The event aimed to promote responsible and transparent youth leadership while enhancing political participation. With 150 attendees, including women, youth, veteran politicians, newly elected National Assembly members, and Persons with Disabilities, the forum was supported by UNFPA and the National Youth Council of The Gambia under the Peace Building Fund. The theme, "Youth Leadership is Progressive for Development," highlighted panel discussions on peacebuilding, inclusive youth political participation, and experience sharing.

Honorable Abdoulie Njai, a young parliamentarian, shared his journey from charity work to advocacy and politics. He emphasized the importance of community engagement and having a clear vision, reflecting on the challenges he faced in connecting with undecided voters and maintaining ethical standards during his campaigns.



COP 27 Climate Summit



Honorable Abdoulie Njai participated in the COP 27 climate summit held on November 6, 2023 in Sharm El-Sheikh, Egypt, where 198 countries gathered under the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change. The summit focused on five key issues: nature conservation, food

security, water resources, industrial de-carbonization, and climate adaptation.

As the national focal point for Parliamentarians Call for Fossil-Free Fuel, Honorable Njai played an active role in discussions, advocating for stronger

international cooperation to tackle climate change. He emphasized the need for transformational policies to achieve 100% renewable energy globally, especially in Africa, and called for the diversification of economies to reduce dependency on fossil fuels. He also stressed the importance of climate finance, urging wealthy nations to deliver timely and adequate support for climate actions, highlighting the severe impact of climate change on vulnerable countries like The Gambia.

Honorable Njai highlighted the risks posed by rising sea levels to agriculture and infrastructure in Banjul, underscoring the need for robust mitigation efforts. He called for international collaboration to support projects like the Ostend Banjul City Link Greening Project and stressed the urgency of climate justice to protect communities affected by climate change. The summit facilitated continued bilateral discussions aimed at addressing these pressing global challenges.

On January 11, 2023, Honorable Abdoulie Njai was a guest panelist at the third edition of the Interfaith Workshop organized by Faith for Our Planet, held at Coco Ocean Hotel.

The workshop focused on climate change and environmental sustainability, where Hon. Njai highlighted humanity's divine responsibility to care for the Earth. He emphasized that it is not in line with faith to damage what God has created, urging responsible action for the preservation of nature.

The event gathered 30 Gambian faith leaders for a one-day training program designed to explore the relationship between faith and environmental advocacy. The workshop aimed to empower these leaders to become climate action advocates within their communities. The panel of speakers, including experts like Reverend Agostao Zita from the Christian Council of Mozambique and Sheikh El_Sunais from Nigeria, discussed the spiritual importance of environmental



preservation and how faith-based values can support global climate action.

The workshop included training on systems thinking and strategies for addressing region-specific climate issues. It also encouraged collaboration between faith-based organizations, government bodies, and civil society to enhance the effectiveness of climate initiatives.

Doha Forum - March 2023

March 7, 2023, Honorable Abdoulie Njai participated in the Doha Forum as a key representative of young voices in the ongoing climate crisis. Serving as a member of the Parliamentarians on Fossil Fuel Mitigation Network, he joined renowned climate activists, including Lidy Nacpil, to deliver a powerful message on the urgency of addressing global warming.

In his presentation, Hon. Njai stressed the need for immediate action to limit global warming to 1.5°C, a target set by the Paris Agreement. He criticized high-emitting, developed countries—particularly those in the Global North—for failing to meet their commitments to reducing greenhouse gas emissions. He also highlighted the disproportionate impact of climate change on least developed countries (LDCs), which contribute the least to global emissions but are most vulnerable to climate-related disasters.



Hon. Njai called for debt cancellation for LDCs in relation to climate issues and pushed for stronger follow-up on climate finance pledges made at the Copenhagen Summit. He also emphasized the importance of increasing private sector contributions to climate finance and supporting LDCs in their transition to renewable energy sources. His participation underscored the crucial

role of civil society in advocating for climate action and the need for continued global support to ensure a sustainable future for all.

Through his statements, Hon. Njai reinforced his commitment to climate justice, urging the international community to take meaningful action to combat climate change and support those most affected by it.

World Youth Day – We Celebrate Youth Resilience

Today, as we gather under the banner of World Youth Day, celebrating the vibrancy and promise of young people across the globe, our hearts are heavy with the awareness that for countless youth, the very essence of youthfulness remains a distant dream. While

many of us cherish memories of carefree days, education, and aspirations, young souls in Gaza, Palestine, and impoverished corners of Africa are robbed of these fundamental joys. Their reality is defined not by dreams, but by survival; not by play, but by pain.

In Gaza

In Gaza, a generation endures unimaginable suffering. Over 12,000 children under five battle acute malnutrition, with 35 precious lives lost to starvation since July alone. Parents face agonizing choices: starve in crumbling shelters or risk death seeking scraps of aid. With 70% of homes, schools, and hospitals reduced to rubble, children scavenge for food in debris. Displacement camps, crammed with 90% of Gaza's population, offer no sanctuary only the relentless echo of bombs and grief. For these youth, "growing up" means burying siblings, not attending school dances; their greatest advocacy is the desperate hope for their next meal.

Meanwhile, across Africa, hunger tightens its grip on 307 million souls 20% of the continent's people. In nations like Sudan and Somalia, conflict and climate collapse have pushed malnutrition rates higher than pre-pandemic levels. Nearly a quarter of African children under five

suffer stunted growth from chronic hunger, while girls face anemia rates nearing 31%, stealing their strength and futures. These young hearts bear burdens no child should carry: walking miles for water instead of attending school, laboring in fields instead of chasing dreams.

Yet amidst this darkness, their resilience shines like defiant stars. In Gaza's ruins, teenagers organize secret classrooms, determined to learn amid Israel's blockade. Across Africa, youth innovate against despair. Somali girls engineer water-harvesting systems, Kenyan teens deploy apps to alert communities of aid. Even oceans away, young activists like Cornell's Sriram Parasurama risk expulsion to protest weapons funding Gaza's war, their voices rising for justice despite threats and suspensions. Their courage is a sacred fire that refuses to be extinguished.



We demand immediate aid flooding Gaza to end famine, and a lasting ceasefire to stop the bombs killing children alongside hope. We call for investment in Africa's social protection and climate-resilient farming, where 545 million now cannot afford healthy diets as the crisis deepens by the day. And we must shield truth-tellers like Momodou Taal, facing deportation for protesting genocide, for academic freedom must defend the brave.

World Youth Forum - Russia

The program convened state managers, public servants, and policy innovators from across the world to engage in high-level discourse, immersive training, and collaborative innovation on the future of public service.

Hon. Njai actively contributed to a series of team-based projects and dialogues, including the design and presentation of a group proposal centered on environmental sustainability and biodiversity preservation, with a special lens on urban ecological resilience drawing

inspiration from Banjul's own Tanbi wetlands. Other team-led presentations included models for scalable youth incubator systems, smart citizen engagement platforms, and cross-border public administration solutions tailored for emerging economies.

The African delegation made remarkable contributions to the program, positioning the continent as a key player in shaping adaptive and visionary public service frameworks. Hon. Njai's participation not only reflected his own leadership acumen but also reaffirmed his continued role as a Pan-African voice for inclusive, youth-driven development and green public policy.

As he departs Russia, Hon. Njai sets his sights on Harare, Zimbabwe, where he has been invited as a



featured guest for an important panel discussion. There, he will present on Banjul's urban biodiversity framework, with a focus on preserving the Tanbi wetlands, while advocating for stronger environmental governance and sustainable city strategies.

This leg of his mission builds upon a growing legacy of transformative leadership rooted in action, innovation, and a steadfast dedication to Africa's shared prosperity. His trajectory from Banjul to the global stage is a testament to what ethical leadership, youthful energy, and visionary thinking can achieve.



RAMSAR COP15 15th Convention on Wetlands

Hon. Njai wraps up his trips by representing The Gambia as a featured speaker on the high-level panel “Enhancing Wetland Governance Through Parliamentary Leadership” at the Ramsar COP15 Convention. Convened under the G20 Global Land Initiative (GLI) and jointly hosted by the (GCAP) and the United Nations System Staff College (UNSSC), this timely side event focused on translating multilateral commitments into national action through legislation, community engagement and cross-sector collaboration.

He shared the platform with two distinguished fellow GCAP parliamentarians: renowned for championing constitutional environmental reforms and community-led land governance; and whose work emphasizes integrating wetlands into freshwater policy and climate resilience planning. The session was expertly moderated by Apoorva Bose a leading UNSSC climate policy specialist instrumental in shaping GCAP’s global capacity-building programs for legislators.

From The Gambia’s perspective, blending his legislative role and civil society leadership experiences, he advocated for the establishment legal safeguards for ecological buffer zones, prohibit illegal encroachment, and



create a national wetland restoration fund leveraging eco-tourism and climate finance. Such measures are vital to protect Gambian wetlands particularly stressed mangrove ecosystems and urban wetlands in Banjul from unregulated development and climate impacts.

Underscoring parliament’s unique role as a bridge between global treaties and local realities, GCAP empowers



legislators to effectively integrate frameworks like Ramsar and UNCCD into national debates and budgetary decisions.

This panel reinforced that effective wetland stewardship demands proactive parliamentary leadership, grounded in inclusive lawmaking and strategic alliances to turn global pledges into local protection.

A Productive Conclusion to the “Constituency Assemblies” Project

Hon. Abdoulie Njai was honored to have participated in the final session of the “Constituency Assemblies: Connecting Parliamentarians with Youth” project, funded by Democracy Reporting International.

The engagement provided a valuable platform for direct and constructive dialogue with the vibrant and passionate youth of Banjul Central and beyond. Discussions focused on key national issues relating to democratic governance and institutional reforms, underscoring the importance of inclusive participation in shaping the future of The Gambia.

Hon. Njai expressed sincere appreciation to his colleague, Hon. Modou Lamin B. Bah, Member for Banjul North Constituency, for co-spearheading the dialogue and contributing meaningfully to an open and productive exchange.

The session marked a fitting conclusion to a project that strengthened engagement between parliamentarians and young people, reaffirming the central role of youth voices in democratic development.



Keynote Speaker on Migration, Drugs and Crime



On December 26, 2023, Hon. Abdoulie Njai played a crucial role as both keynote speaker and panelist in a dialogue focused on migration, trafficking in persons, and the impact of drugs and crime on youth. Organized by The Gambia Cyber Security Alliance in partnership with the UNODC and PROMIS, the event included distinguished speakers such as UN Resident Coordinator Dr. Desta Alamerew Tiruneh, Mr. Muhammed Ngallan, and

Madam Fatou Geo Barry. Hon. Njai shared valuable insights on the negative consequences of drug consumption and emphasized the need for more recreational facilities and social amenities. He called for prisons to focus on rehabilitation rather than punishment to address these challenges.

In a separate panel discussion moderated by Mr. Muhammed Kanyi, Hon. Njai elaborated on available opportunities for young people and stressed the importance of community involvement in combating drug consumption. He advocated for harsher punishments for drug dealers and provided guidance to youth on how to overcome their challenges, emphasizing leadership, exploration in various fields, and ethical conduct.

Hon. Njai reiterated his commitment to advocating for youth issues both within The Gambia and across the African continent, commending the organizers for their dedication to addressing these critical issues and reaffirming his support for the youth.

Honorable Njai reiterated his commitment to supporting people with disabilities, as promised in his four-point campaign agenda. He emphasized the need for collaboration among lawmakers to address the challenges faced by the community.

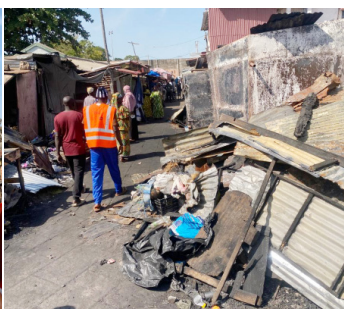
During the visit, it was revealed that GOVI members face several difficulties, including a shortage of Braille machines, insufficient white canes, and a lack of social welfare subsidies.

The team toured GOVI's facilities, including the IT section, the main hall (under construction), and the handicraft

lab. It was clear that despite GOVI's efforts, The Gambia faces ongoing challenges in providing essential resources for people with disabilities. Public buildings and transportation systems lack the necessary infrastructure, such as ramps and accessible restrooms, to support individuals with physical disabilities.

Despite these obstacles, the visiting team praised GOVI's dedication and called on those with resources to assist. They stressed the need for collective action to improve the lives of people with disabilities in The Gambia and encouraged public awareness of the community's needs.

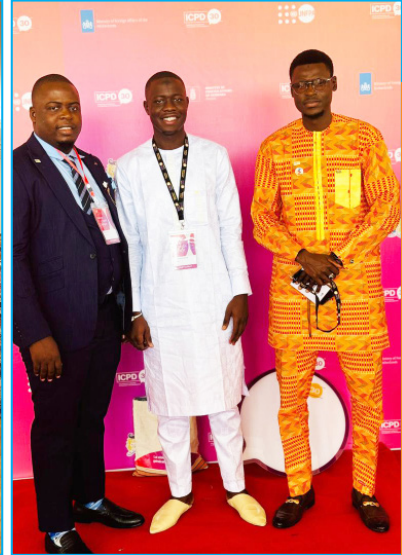
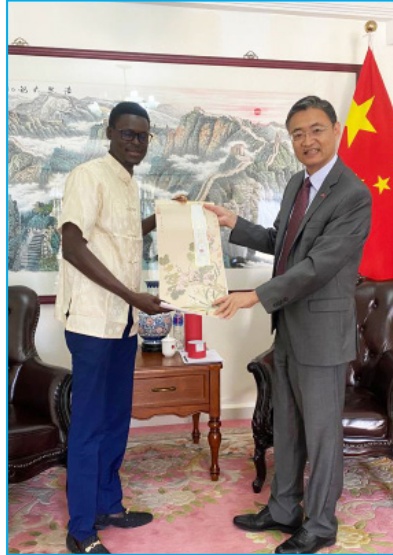

However, looking forward, the lessons learnt in Bangkok reaffirmed the importance of community-based

renewable initiatives that empower citizens, enhance local ownership, and foster sustainable livelihoods. Across Africa and in The Gambia ideas and frameworks inspired by these discussions are already being developed to strengthen local energy resilience and equity.

The future of energy must be just, inclusive, and collaborative driven by shared knowledge between the Global South and reinforced by effective legislative action.



Routine Monitoring of Greening Projects *Future Proof*

On October 19, 2023, Honorable Abdoulie Njai participated in a routine monitoring session of greening projects along Banjul's coastal areas, focusing particularly on the success of coconut palm plantations. These trees, known for their resilience, have thrived despite environmental challenges like rising sea levels, which pose a significant threat to Banjul. Initiatives such as the Future Proof Team's efforts in monitoring the coconut trees on the beach are vital to the city's sustainability.

Honorable Njai, who previously chaired the Development Oriented Citizens (DOC) in Banjul, played a crucial role in the partnership between Banjul City Council and DOC, following the signing of a historic M.O.U. His leadership in the Banjul Greening Pilot Project in 2017 laid the groundwork for these efforts, bringing together key stakeholders like the mayor and the first lady to boost greening initiatives in the city.

Throughout the six-day tour, the Committee engaged with contractors, consultants, engineers, and supervisors to evaluate the status of key road

projects, including the Nuimi Hakalang Road, Kaur Jimbala Road, Kabada Corridor Road Project, Kiang Road Project, and the OMVG Electricity Project. The Committee also inspected urban roads to ensure comprehensive oversight of the country's infrastructure development.

The engagements were designed to provide the Committee with a clear understanding of both the progress and challenges involved in the implementation of these projects.

Regarding road infrastructure, the Committee raised concerns over delays, particularly highlighting the urgency of expediting work on drainage systems in urban areas to mitigate potential flooding during the upcoming rainy season. Delays in the relocation of utilities, such as water pipes, network cables, and electricity lines, were also identified as significant challenges hindering progress.

The Committee remains optimistic that continued engagement with stakeholders will ensure the timely advancement of these projects while maintaining adherence to the quality standards outlined in the contracts.

Public Enterprises Committee Outreach in Basse

This Public Enterprises Committee (PEC) of the National Assembly, with support from the Gambia Fiscal Management Development Project (GFMDP), took their work to the people through a public outreach program in Basse, Upper River Region (URR).

The initiative, launched on Monday, April 15th, 2024, aimed to bridge the gap between citizens and their elected officials.

The program focused on educating

residents about the PEC's role in overseeing state-owned enterprises (SOEs) and collecting valuable feedback on the services provided by these entities. Committee members were eager to hear firsthand from citizens about their experiences with essential services. "Many constituents lack regular opportunities to connect with their representatives," explained Committee Chairperson Hon. Lamin J. Sanneh. "These strategic outreaches offer a crucial platform for open dialogue."



The outreach began with discussions with the Office of the Governor of URR, the Basse Area Council, and Gambia Radio & Television Services (GRTS), focusing on the PEC's oversight responsibilities regarding SOEs operating within Basse.

Looking ahead, the outreach program is expected to enhance accountability among PEC members, increase citizen access to parliament, and shape future strategies for improving services based on public feedback.

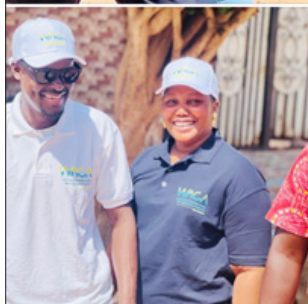

This initiative is part of WACA's wider commitment to protect coastal zones, build community resilience, and support sustainable ecosystem management across West Africa.

As legislators, we remain committed to monitoring progress, ensuring accountability, and



advocating for policies that sustain these vital interventions. Protecting our environment is not only a

developmental duty it's a moral obligation to the generations that will inherit it.

The delegation will return with actionable strategies to inform The Gambia's National Land Policy Implementation process.

As a member of the National Assembly Select Committee on Regional Government, Lands, IEC, and Ombudsman, I recently concluded a four-day study tour in Senegal. The delegation with support staff aimed to benchmark parliamentary best practices and strengthen collaboration between the two legislatures. The delegation was led by chairman of the Committee El Hajj Hon Sulayman Jammeh.

During the engagements, members contributed to discussions as the committee met with their Senegalese counterparts responsible for urban planning and decentralisation.

UTG NSA's upcoming outreach programs, ensuring that nursing students were better equipped to deliver essential health services across communities nationwide.

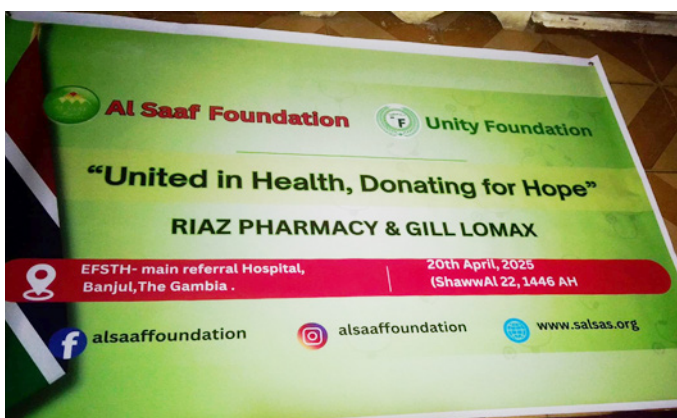

Final Note

As countless legislative signs of progress have been made, I will highlight just a few very important ones that have been a public cry to Gambians and most especially Banjul specifically Banjul Central:

Reinventing Tenant Protection – *The Rent Act Amendments*

One of the most pressing issues facing many Gambians is the challenge of unaffordable and unpredictable rent. I am proud to highlight the recent legislative advancements embodied in the Rent (Amendment) Bill, 2023, which modernizes the Rent Act of 2014. This initiative addresses the plight of tenants and ensures that our housing policies reflect the economic realities of today. Key provisions include:

1. Cap on Rent Increases:

Landlords are now restricted from raising rent by more than 5% every three years, ensuring that increases are gradual and predictable.

2. Advance Payment Limitations:

For low-cost rental premises—those costing GMD 7,000 or less—tenants will no longer be forced to pay six months' rent in advance. Instead, monthly payments are allowed, reducing the financial burden on ordinary citizens.

3. Eviction Protections:

A standardized 90-day notice period has been established before any eviction can take place, protecting tenants from abrupt displacement and giving them sufficient time to secure alternative housing.

4. Landlord Obligations:

Landlords must maintain rented premises in a habitable condition throughout the tenancy, ensuring

that necessary repairs and upkeep are a legal obligation rather than an optional extra.

Beyond the Rent Act, my work in Parliament has also concentrated on broader issues critical to our nation's progress. In keeping with our commitment to serve decisively, I have actively championed measures in the following areas:

Among Other Notable Bills Passed/Amended:

1. State-Owned Enterprises Bill, 2022

This bill, passed by the Assembly, sets out a framework for restructuring state-owned enterprises to boost transparency, efficiency, and fiscal discipline within public sector management.

2. Women's (Amendment) Bill, 2024

In a highly debated move, Members of Parliament initially proposed a bill that would have repealed the 2015 ban on female genital mutilation. After widespread public outcry and civil society mobilization, lawmakers reversed course—ultimately reaffirming the longstanding prohibition against FGM, which I voted in favour of.

3. Labour Act, 2023

Tabled by the Minister for Trade, Industry, Regional Integration, and Employment, this act—now assented—introduces reforms to improve worker rights, modernize employment relations, and foster a more inclusive labour market amid the economic transformation.

4. Criminal Procedure Act, 2023

Recently passed and assented, this act refines criminal justice processes to ensure fairer

trials and more efficient court procedures. Its reforms aim to enhance accountability within law enforcement and protect the rights of defendants.

NO MORE DYING AT HOSPITAL GATES!

The dividends of principled representation are realized when pragmatism meets institutional accountability. My sustained advocacy on emergency healthcare protocols exemplifies this: by compelling state institutions to prioritize citizens over bureaucracy, we have transformed policy into life-saving action. This reform is a testament to what focused parliamentary oversight can achieve."

Hon. Njai's parliamentary demand for urgent reform of medical emergency protocols has triggered decisive action as the Office of the Inspector General of Police has officially directed ALL health facilities to "Accord PROMPT medical attention to emergencies WITH or WITHOUT police escort".

This policy shift communicated to every health facility Department of Health ends lethal delays at hospital gates. When second decide survival, bureaucracy must never override humanity.

We commend the Minister and Department of Health prioritizing patient survival over procedure. The Police Leadership for institutional flexibility. Every citizen who shared harrowing ER stories.

Our work continues to ensure FULL implementation. But today, Gambia takes a vital step toward a healthcare system where no life bleeds out waiting for paperwork

Draft Constitution Status (2022–2025)

The Gambia has not successfully adopted a new constitution in this period. The 1997 Constitution remains in force because the legislature has twice rejected proposed new drafts intended to replace it.

In 2024, the Government tabled a Draft Constitution (Constitution of the Republic of The Gambia – Promulgation Bill 2024) aimed at overhauling the country’s legal framework, including introducing reforms such as presidential term limits and modern governance structures. The draft was gazetted in August 2024 and underwent readings in the National Assembly.

In my view, based on consultations and interactions across communities, a significant number of Gambians became fixated on a binary narrative: the 2020 Draft Constitution as “the people’s draft” and the **2024 Draft as “the government’s draft,” largely due to executive alterations. This framing created a serious vacuum in public understanding of the actual contents of the draft, limiting citizens’ ability to make fully informed judgments.

This challenge, in my assessment, was compounded by political rivalries, where debates were driven less by holistic engagement with the draft and more by selective focus on clauses of convenience. As a result, the broader constitutional architecture, trade-offs, and safeguards received insufficient attention in public discourse.

It was against this background that I supported committal of the draft to committee, in line with the National Assembly’s Standing Orders, which mandate committee referral to allow for detailed clause-by-clause scrutiny, expert input, and wider stakeholder engagement. Such a process would have created space for deeper consultations, structured dialogue, and clearer public education on the draft as a whole.

This rejection marked the second major setback for constitutional reform in The Gambia, echoing a similar failure in 2020 when an earlier draft was also blocked in the Assembly.

As it was evident consensus remained difficult to achieve at the parliamentary level, a referendum could have remained a viable democratic option, allowing the people to directly exercise their sovereign right to determine their constitutional future.

On 7 July 2025, the National Assembly voted on the draft constitution at its second reading stage. Although a majority (35 out of 56 lawmakers) voted in favour, the bill failed to secure the constitutionally required three-quarters majority needed to advance to further consideration. As a result, the draft constitution did not proceed and remains constitutionally stalled.

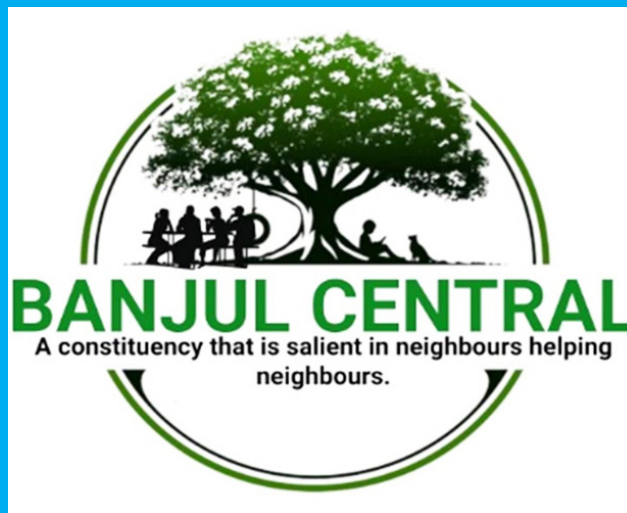
National Assembly Ratifications (2022–2025)

Between 2022 and 2025, the National Assembly ratified key international instruments to strengthen The Gambia’s role in cultural heritage protection, diplomatic engagement, and labour mobility. These actions reflect Parliament’s commitment to aligning domestic law with international standards.
